Choose <u>two</u> of the following questions to respond to in at least <u>a half-page each</u>. Shoot for strong paragraphs using topic sentences and supporting details: use real-life examples and references to the "The Lottery" to explain your opinions. Due next class.

- 1. Write about rituals/traditions in our society that seem barbaric or against the morals of society.
- 2. What values are present in or absent from the story? Are compassion and responsibility represented at all?
- 3. Is this a story about conformity, or is there more to it?
- 4. What are our responsibilities as individuals? What would you do, realistically, if you lived in that town?
- 5. Write about the human need for a scapegoat (trying to find someone to blame/hold responsible).
- 6. Write about how fragile loyalties to family or community can be when put to the test.
- 7. Write about the human tendency to be unquestioning—to keep doing things even though we know they are wrong.
- 8. Write about human brutality and our levels of intrigue and/or indifference to it.
